## **Year 12 into Year 13 September Assessments**

As we approach the end of a very strange academic year, I would like to thank you for all the support you have offered to your child's endeavours over the last few months. The vast majority of students have coped extremely well under very challenging circumstances and demonstrated all the characteristics that we value and expect of our students in our Sixth Form as they make their way into adulthood. We are very proud of them.

Looking forward to the next academic year, we are now planning to be able to fully support and guide the students in their next steps. This is partly achieved through engagement in extra-curricular opportunities, but we also need to be able to accurately assess their academic progress. We will be covering these themes in our remaining Thursday Student-CPD sessions, but it would be beneficial if you were able to reinforce this at home.
