- Critically evaluate concepts and make valued judgements and arguments.
- Explore a range of different beliefs, values and opinions, including their own thoughts and ideas.
- Make judgements on topical issues whilst using key terminology.

WHEN HISTORIANS THINK THEY:

- Think critically by Evaluating, Analysing, Enquiring and Synthesising.
- Question the world around them and the thoughts of Historians.
- Consider big ideas or enquiries across long periods of time.
- Are compassionate and open-minded.
- Use primary and secondary sources to guide their thinking.
- Compare and contrast causes and effects.
