



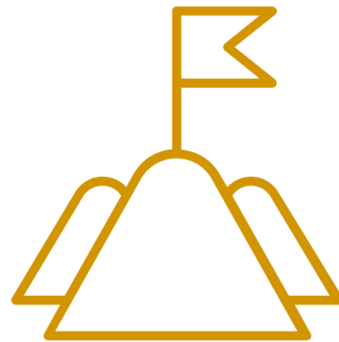

Core Humanities Priorities

- Both subjects are very content and skills heavy
- This means that revision is essential, and a little and often approach best suits the courses- 2 years worth of content needs to be revisited throughout year 11 to ensure it is not 'lost'
- Using the 5 habits is essential for all grades- but top grades require practice exam questions and feedback
- Geography- Field work essential for paper 3

Geography | Key Knowledge requirements

- Students have excellent knowledge of key case studies for Paper 1 and Paper 2. e.g. Typhoon Haiyan 2013.
- Students can explain the formation of a range of processes effectively in chronological order e.g. The formation of a sea stack.
- Use many specific facts and figures to provide evidence and used consistently. E.g. A primary effect of Typhoon Haiyan was 30,000 fishing boats were destroyed this led to further economic problems because over 6 million people lost a source of income.

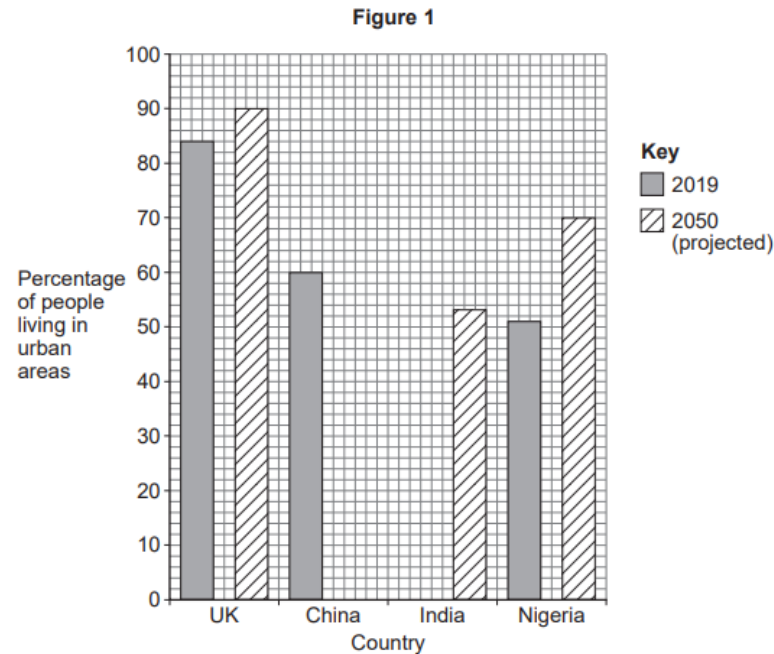
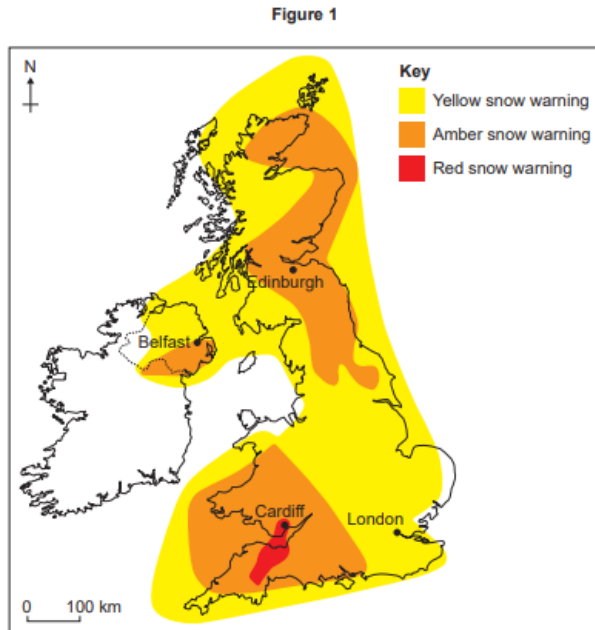

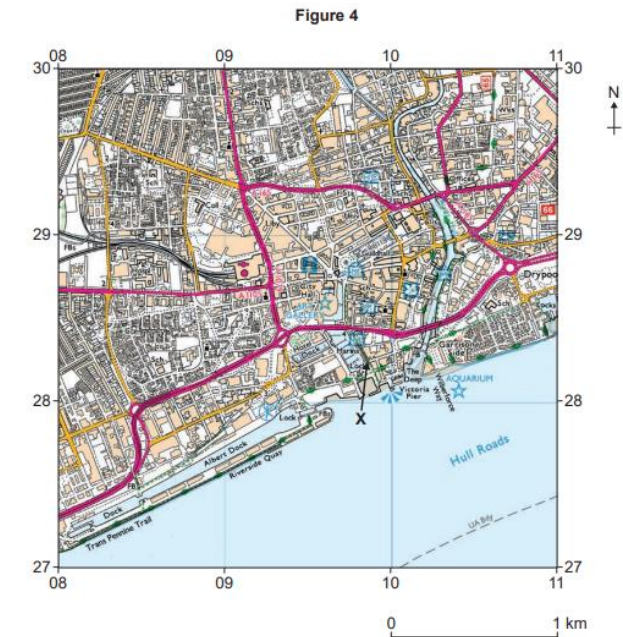

 1. Germany 1890-1945 (Weimar Govt, Nazi rise, how did Hitler control the People? Propaganda and Terror)
 2. Conflict and Tension 1918-1939 (TOV, LON, What caused World War Two?: Appeasement/Hitler/Treaty of Versailles etc)
 3. The Normans 1066-1100: Wales Environmental study: Consider the impact of the Norman rule (Military, Political, Economic and Religious)
 4. Health and the People 1000-Present day: Comparing events over time (We still have this to do)
